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BACKGROUND

This information package presents summary Year 12 student achievement data for schools that had Year 12 students in 2010.

Context for 2010

The period 2007 to 2009 was a transition time when students could achieve a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) by studying combinations of TEE and WSA subjects and WACE course units. During this period, participation in TEE and WSA subjects declined as new courses replaced these subjects.

2010 is the first year when all of the 52 WACE courses were offered to students.

Examinations in these courses were compulsory for Year 12 students studying a pair of Stage 2 or 3 units.

In 2010, there were 23,153 Year 12 students, compared to 21,561 in 2009, 20,444 in 2008, 21,186 in 2007 and 20,035 in 2006. The number of students who achieved graduation has gradually increased since 1999 when the Year 12 student achievement data was first released:

Interpreting data tables

The data tables are about the achievement of students at schools and should not be used to draw simplistic conclusions about the performance of schools. The following general qualifiers should be recognised:

- Many factors affect student achievement, some of which are outside the control of schools.
 These include differences in ability, cultural and language background, educational background of parents and economic differences.
- No single table or data source should prevail in drawing conclusions about the performance of students at schools. A more realistic picture is gained from a composite view of all tables.
- The statistics of a single year should not be considered in isolation, rather the trend or pattern over a number of years should be considered.
- Small numbers of candidates at a school can bias inferences, particularly with percentages.

The data that will be of interest to the community are the proportions, at each school, of:

- All students who achieved a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).
- Students who sat the WACE course examinations and who achieved a WACE course score
 of 65 and above.
- Students who sat the WACE course examinations and who achieved a WACE course score
 of 75 and above.
- Vocational Education and Training (VET) students who completed 220 or more nominal hours of VET.
- VET students in a school who completed at least one AQF VET Certificate II or higher qualification.

There are three sets of tables presented.

- 1. The first set of tables identify the schools with 100% achievement of the WACE and first 50 schools, in rank order, for each of the last four criteria mentioned above.
- 2. The second set of tables lists all schools, in alphabetical order, for each of the criteria mentioned above, plus WACE course unit completions for each school, WACE course unit achievements at Stage 2 and Stage 3 for each school, schools with the highest achieving students in each Stage 2 and Stage 3 WACE courses, VET qualifications achieved for each school and endorsed program completions for each school.
- 3. The third set of tables presents the Year 12 State statistics for 2010.

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WACE the Western Australian Certificate of Education is issued to students who meet the requirements.

Terms used

WACE course are courses that have been phased in as a result of the review into senior secondary education. These courses have

replaced TEE subjects and WSA subjects.

VET vocational education and training. Units of competency are

completed towards a training qualification.

DATA HIGHLIGHTS

Year 12 population

- In 2010, 23,153 Year 12 students undertook studies towards the WACE. This is an increase of 7.4% on the 21,561 in 2009.
- In addition, in 2010, 4,099 (4,994 in 2009) seventeen year olds were engaged in apprenticeships, traineeships, employment and/or training. These young people were not enrolled in schools.
- In 2010, there continued to be a decrease in the number of students repeating or reentering Year 12 (from 280 in 2009 to 253 in 2010).
- In 2010, the number of mature age Year 12 students remained stable at 410 in 2010 compared to 409 in 2009.

Secondary graduation (WACE)

- Of the 23,153 (21,561 in 2009) Year 12 students, 21,296 (19,830 in 2009) full-time students were eligible to graduate.
- In 2010, 97.3% of eligible students graduated. The graduation rate has steadily increased since 2000, when only 91.5% of Year 12 students graduated.

WACE course examinations

 More Year 12 students (13,041) sat four or more WACE course examinations, than in 2009 (11,735). This represents a 11.1% increase in the number of 2010 Year 12 students who sat four or more WACE course examinations and were therefore eligible for an ATAR.

WACE courses

• 21,296 (18,895 in 2009) Year 12 students completed at least two WACE course units. Of these, 11,902 (7,232 in 2009) achieved an A grade in at least one course unit.

VET

- In 2010, 33.6% (30.4% in 2009) of Year 12 students participated in VET programs.
- In 2010, 6,578 Year 12 students achieved at least one VET qualification in Year 10, 11 or 12, compared with 4,955 in 2009.
- In 2010, there were 4,343 Certificate II, III or IV achieved as compared with 3,437 in 2009, 3,656 in 2008 and 2,509 in 2007. 698 (537 in 2009) students achieved Certificate III and 133 (82 in 2009) students achieved a Certificate IV.
- In 2010, 697 Year 12 students achieved a Certificate I in Business. This was also the most popular qualification in 2009 where it was achieved by 312 Year 12 students.

Endorsed programs contributing to the WACE

In 2010, 3,929 students completed at least one endorsed program. Of these, 67 completed university programs, 1,412 students completed personal development programs, 703 students completed community organisation programs and 1,790 students completed workplace learning as an endorsed program.

There were 25 (30 in 2009; 22 in 2008) government schools, 4 (3 in 2009; 4 in 2008) Catholic schools and 10 (7 in 2009; 8 in 2008) independent schools that had in 2010, less than 20 full-time eligible to graduate Year 12 students. These schools are omitted from the attached tables.

Senior campuses (Cyril Jackson Senior campus and North Lake Senior campus), senior colleges (Canning College and Tuart College), Australian Technical Colleges, overseas schools and the School of Isolated and Distance Education and primary schools are omitted.





Achievement Tables 2010

2010 Student Achievement Tables

The following tables present a number of different ways to represent the relative achievements of students at different schools. These tables do not contain information about the 'value adding' of schools to each of their students over their years of senior secondary schooling. A school may appear in none of these tables but may have improved, significantly beyond expectation, the achievements of its students during these years.

Each way of presenting data has its limitations, and conclusions drawn from these tables must be made cautiously. For example, and in relation to the 75+ table, a school may have a large number of students with WACE course scores of 74, but no students with a WACE course score above 74, and hence the school will not appear in this table. Thus, failure to appear in this table does not imply that students at this school have not performed well.

1. Schools with 100% graduation

This table shows each school that achieved 100% graduation. To be eligible to graduate, students must have had the opportunity to complete the Curriculum Council requirements to receive a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE). In some instances, students may be included in the 'eligible to graduate' statistic even though these students have a very limited capacity to achieve graduation. An example of this may be a foreign exchange student who is completing a full suite of WACE courses but who will be unable to achieve English language competence.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students are not included.

2. First 50 WACE course examinations schools (WACE Stage 3 course score of 75+)

This statistic is based on the count of Stage 3 courses in a school where a WACE course score of 75 or above was achieved. This count of courses takes into account students who achieved at this level in one or several courses (e.g. a student who achieved four WACE course scores above 75 is included in the calculation four times). This count is then converted to a percentage of the total Stage 3 courses examined at the school.

The table recognises schools which have a high proportion of students who have achieved the excellent standard in a WACE course - i.e. a WACE course score of above 75.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students are not included.

3. First 50 WACE course examinations schools (WACE Stage 3 course score of 65+)

This statistic is based on the count of Stage 3 courses in a school where a WACE course score of 65 or above was achieved. This count of courses takes into account students who achieved at this level in one or several courses (e.g. a student who achieved four WACE course scores above 65 is included in the calculation four times). This count is then converted to a percentage of the total Stage 3 courses examined at the school.

The table recognises schools which have a high proportion of students who have achieved the excellent or high standard in a WACE course - i.e. a WACE course score of above 65.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students are not included.

4. First 50 VET schools – participation

This table shows the percentage of students in a school who completed at least 220 nominal hours of VET. Schools are ranked according to the percentage of students who have completed 220 hours of more. This level of participation equates to the time required to complete four WACE course units.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students or with less than 10 students enrolled in at least 1 VET unit of competency have been omitted.

5. First 50 VET schools – achievement

This table shows the percentage of VET students in a school who completed at least one AQF VET Certificate II or higher qualification. Schools are ranked according to the percentage of students who have completed at least one AQF VET Certificate II or higher qualification.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students, or with less than 10 students enrolled in at least 1 VET unit of competency, have been omitted.

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Schools with 100% graduation

This table displays schools which have achieved 100% WACE graduation.

To be included in the table a student must be a full-time Year 12 student who is eligible to graduate. The students must have results for at least 20 WACE course units (or equivalent). Eligible to graduate in the current year means that a student would graduate if he or she obtained a grade in all current year course units. This includes students with results from every year on record, and students who have Year 11 equivalent achievements.

Graduation means 'achievement of a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)'.

The requirements to qualify for a WACE are:

Breadth and depth

Students must complete at least 20 units, of which at least 10 must be from WACE courses.

- The 20 units must include at least three two-unit combinations from different WACE courses and also include:
 - four course units from English, Literature and/or English as an Additional Language/Dialect studied over a minimum of two years post Year 10 (a minimum of two of these units must be completed in Year 12) and
 - a minimum of one pair of course units from each of List A (arts/languages/social sciences) and List B (mathematics/science/technology) in their final year.

Achievement standard

Students must achieve a C grade average or better across 10 course units.

- These 10 units must include:
 - the last two-unit combination completed in three different courses
 - one unit from each of two other different courses
 - other units with the highest achievement to make up the balance of the 10 units.
- Endorsed programs and/or vocational education and training (VET) credit transfer (stand-alone) can reduce the number of course units and courses required by up to 40 per cent.

English language competence

Students must meet the standard for English language competence as defined by work samples; typically this is a C grade or better in any Stage 1 or higher English unit (except 1A and 1B for English as an Additional Language/Dialect).

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students are not included.

- Many factors affect student achievement, some of which are outside the control of schools.

Achievement standard

Students must achieve a C grade average or better across 10 course units.

- These 10 units must include:
 - the last two-unit combination completed in three different courses
 - one unit from each of two other different courses
 - other units with the highest achievement to make up the balance of the 10 units.
- Endorsed programs and/or vocational education and training (VET) credit transfer (stand-alone) can reduce the number of course units and courses required by up to 40 per cent.

English language competence

Students must meet the standard for English language competence as defined by work samples; typically this is a C grade or better in any Stage 1 or higher English unit (except 1A and 1B for English as an Additional Language/Dialect).

Percentage

This column expresses the number of students who graduated as a percentage of all students eligible to graduate.

This report consists of seven sections.

Section 1: Summary school statistics

1a Student population

This gives the number of Year 12 students who completed at least one course unit or equivalent and the number of repeaters, overseas students and mature age students.

Note: 'Completing' a course unit is defined as obtaining either a valid grade (A, B, C, D, or E) or U notation in the course unit.

'Repeaters' are Year 12 students who complete at least one course unit or equivalent in the year following first enrolment in Year 12.

'Re-enterers' are Year 12 students who complete at least one course unit or equivalent more than one year after first enrolment in Year 12.

'Mature-age' students were aged 19 or more on 1 March of the year in which their results were awarded.

1b Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)

This gives the number of full-time students who are eligible to graduate (achieve the WACE), achieve English language competence and who graduated (achieved the WACE).

The WACE signifies that students have met the breadth and depth, achievement standard and English language competence requirements in their senior secondary schooling. The Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) is awarded to students who have successfully met the requirements for breadth and depth, the achievement standard and English language competence in their senior secondary schooling.

These requirements are:

Breadth and depth

Students must complete at least 20 units, of which at least 10 must be from WACE courses.

- The 20 units must include at least three two-unit combinations from different WACE courses and also include:
 - four course units from English, Literature and/or English as an Additional Language/Dialect studied over a minimum of two years post Year 10 (a minimum of two of these units must be completed in Year 12) and
 - a minimum of one pair of course units from each of List A (arts/languages/social sciences) and List B (mathematics/science/technology) in their final year.

Achievement standard

Students must achieve a C grade average or better across 10 course units.

- These 10 units must include:
 - the last two-unit combination completed in three different courses
 - one unit from each of two other different courses
 - other units with the highest achievement to make up the balance of the 10 units.
- Endorsed programs and/or vocational education and training (VET) credit transfer (stand-alone) can reduce the number of course units and courses required by up to 40 per cent.

English language competence

Students must meet the standard for English language competence as defined by work samples; typically this is a C grade or better in any Stage 1 or higher English unit (except 1A and 1B for English as an Additional Language/Dialect).

The detailed requirements for achievement of the WACE may be found in the information paper *The WACE – Your Guide to the Western Australian Certificate of Education, Statement of Results and Course Report 2010* and also on the Council's website at

www.curriculum.wa.edu.au/internet/Senior Secondary/The WACE/WACE Requirements

It has been agreed, in consultation with stakeholders, that the percentage of graduating students should be calculated from a base population consisting only of those full-time Year 12 students who could have achieved the WACE (if they had achieved at a suitable level). The population of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE is also used as a base when calculating the numbers of WACE examination students, course unit students and VET students.

1c WACE course unit students

This gives the number of full-time students who are eligible to achieve the WACE, and who obtained results (i.e. a valid grade A, B, C, D, E or U notation) in at least two WACE course units.

Generally, students taking fewer than four Stage 2 or Stage 3 course unit pairs are not able to obtain an ATAR, so they may be regarded as not aspiring to university study in the following year.

1d WACE examination students

This gives the number of students who are eligible to achieve the WACE, and who obtained four or more WACE course scores. Usually students aspiring to enter university need at least four scaled scores to obtain an ATAR.

Also, included is the number of these students who obtained a WACE course score of 75 or more.

1e VET students

This gives the number of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE who enrolled in at least one unit of competency in Year 12.

Also reported are the number of students who achieved qualifications in Year 10, Year 11 or Year 12 and the number of students who achieved a Certificate II or higher in Year 10, Year 11 or Year 12.

Students in this category may also belong to categories 1c or 1d.

1f Endorsed program students

These students are defined as full-time students who are eligible to achieve a WACE, and who were enrolled in at least one endorsed program.

Also reported is the number of students who achieved a result in at least one endorsed program.

Students in this category may also belong to categories 1c or 1d.

Section 2: WACE course units

Table 2 gives the distribution of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE, by the number of course units completed by each student.

Section 3: WACE examination courses

Table 3 gives the distribution of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE, by the number of WACE course examinations sat by each student. Sub-totals show the number of students who sat enough courses to obtain an ATAR (at least four), and the number who completed less than four course exams. The number of WACE examination courses sat by a student is defined as the number of WACE course scores obtained.

Section 4: VET studies

VET credit transfer (stand alone) units of competency count towards achievement of the WACE. Where units of competency are integrated/embedded in Curriculum Council courses, they cannot be used to claim VET unit equivalents. Care must be taken to avoid counting them twice.

Table 4a shows the distribution of unit equivalents achieved for units of competency amongst full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE. A total of 55 nominal hours of VET credit transfer (stand-alone) units of competency is equivalent to one course unit.

Table 4b shows the distribution of qualifications achieved amongst full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE. Students who have achieved more than one qualification will be counted as many times as they have achieved qualifications.

Section 5: Endorsed programs

Endorsed programs count towards the achievement of the WACE.

Table 5 shows the distribution of unit equivalents achieved for endorsed programs amongst full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE. A unit equivalent of an endorsed program is equivalent to one course unit.

Section 6: Summary of students' results by grade for course units

Table 6 shows the number and percentage of Year 12 students awarded each of the grades (A, B, C, D and E) for each WACE course unit by gender. In addition, statistical tests have been carried out to compare the performance of males against females within the State.

Under the heading *better performing group* the following entries may be found:

Entry	Meaning
Males	In this school, males had higher grades than females.
Females	In this school, females had higher grades than males.
NS	The statistical test showed no significant difference between groups.
-	No test was carried out because there were not enough candidates.

Section 7: Summary of WACE course scores

Table 7 shows the distribution of WACE course scores achieved by students for each Stage 2 and Stage 3 course (i.e. pair of units)

This distribution is shown in two different ways:

- i) summary statistics of mean, maximum, minimum and standard deviation of WACE course scores; and
- ii) counts and percentages of students with achievements in each of the five bands, or standards, of WACE course scores.

For comparative purposes, the same information is provided at the State level.
