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BACKGROUND

This information package presents summary Year 12 student achievement data for schools that had Year 12 students in 2012.

Context for 2012

2012 was the third year that schools could select from the full list of 52 WACE courses. Each school offered its students a range of these courses.

The 2012 data include achievement in the following WACE courses:

Examinations in these courses were compulsory for Year 12 students who were studying a pair of Stage 2 or a pair of Stage 3 units, unless they were exempt.

In 2012, there were 23879 Year 12 students. Comparatively, there were 23,564 in 2011, 23,153 in 2010, 21,561 in 2009 and 20,444 in 2008.

Of these 23879 Year 12 students, 21939 were eligible to graduate.

Interpreting data tables

The data tables are about the achievement of students at schools and should not be used to draw simplistic conclusions about the performance of schools. The following general qualifiers should be recognised:

- Many factors affect student achievement, some of which are outside the control of schools. These include differences in ability, cultural and language background, educational background of parents and economic differences.
- No single table or data source should prevail in drawing conclusions about the performance of students at schools. A more realistic picture is gained from a composite view of all tables.
- The statistics of a single year should not be considered in isolation, rather the trend or pattern over a number of years should be considered.
- Small numbers of candidates at a school can bias inferences, particularly with percentages.

The data that will be of interest to the community are the proportions, at each school, of:

- all students who achieved a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).
- students who sat the WACE course examinations and who achieved a WACE course score of 65 and above.
- students who sat the WACE course examinations and who achieved a WACE course score of 75 and above.
- vocational education and training (VET) students who completed 220 or more nominal hours of VET.
- VET students in a school who completed at least one AQF VET Certificate II or higher qualification.

There are three sets of tables presented.

- 1. The first set of tables identifies first 50 schools, in rank order, for each of the last four criteria mentioned above.
- 2. The second set of tables list all schools, in alphabetical order, for each of the criteria mentioned above, plus WACE course unit completions for each school, WACE course unit achievements at Stage 2 and Stage 3 for each school, schools with the highest achieving students in each Stage 2 and Stage 3 WACE course, VET qualifications achieved for each school and endorsed program completions for each school.
- 3. The third set of tables presents the Year 12 State statistics for 2012.

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DATA HIGHLIGHTS

Year 12 population

- In 2012, 23,879 Year 12 students undertook studies towards the WACE. This is an increase of 1.3 per cent on the 23,564 students in 2011.
- In addition, in 2012 3,888 (4,030 in 2011 and 4,099 in 2010) 17 year olds were engaged in apprenticeships, traineeships, employment and/or training. These young people were not enrolled in schools.
- In 2012, there was a decrease in the number of students repeating or re-entering Year 12 (from 293 in 2011 to 274 in 2012).
- In 2012, the number of mature-age Year 12 students decreased to 410 compared with 463 in 2011.

Secondary graduation (WACE)

- Of the 23,879 Year 12 students (23,564 in 2011, 23,153 in 2010), 21,939 full-time students were eligible to graduate (21,621 in 2011, 21,296 in 2010).
- In 2012, 97.0 per cent of eligible Year 12 students graduated (97.4 per cent in 2011). The graduation rate has steadily increased since 2000, when 91.5 per cent of eligible Year 12 students graduated to approximately 97 per cent in 2010 and has remained steady since then.

WACE course examinations

• Slightly less Year 12 students (13,001) sat four or more WACE course examinations, than in 2011 (13,199). Students who sit four or more WACE course examinations are eligible for an ATAR.

WACE courses

21,937 (21,621 in 2011, 21,296 in 2010) Year 12 students completed at least two WACE course units. Of these, 12,087 (11,869 in 2011, 11,902 in 2010) achieved an A grade in at least one course unit.

VET

- In 2012, 36.0 per cent (34.2 per cent in 2011, 33.6 per cent in 2010) of Year 12 students participated in VET programs.
- In 2012, 8,193 Year 12 students achieved at least one VET qualification in Year 10, 11 or 12, compared with 7,002 in 2011 and 6,578 in 2010.
- In 2012, there were 7,093 Certificates II, III or IV achieved. Comparative figures for 2011, 2010 and 2009 were 4,905, 4,343 and 3,437 respectively. In 2012, 835 students achieved Certificate III and 272 students achieved a Certificate IV. The respective numbers in 2011 were 687 and 160 and in 2010 were 659 and 133.
- In 2012, 1040 Year 12 students achieved a Certificate II in Business. In 2011 the most popular qualification was also the Certificate II in Business, achieved by 793 Year 12 students.

Endorsed programs contributing to the WACE

• In 2012, 5,640 students completed at least one endorsed program. Of these, 86 completed university programs, 2,238 students completed personal development programs, 1,118 students completed community organisation programs and 2,198 students completed workplace learning as an endorsed program.

2012 Student Achievement Tables

The following tables present a number of different ways to represent the relative achievements of students at different schools. These tables do not contain information about the 'value adding' of schools to each of their students over their years of senior secondary schooling. A school may appear in none of these tables but may have improved, significantly beyond expectation, the achievements of its students during these years.

Each way of presenting data has its limitations, and conclusions drawn from these tables must be made cautiously. For example, and in relation to the 75+ table, a school may have a large number of students with WACE course scores of 74, but no students with a WACE course score above 74, and hence the school will not appear in this table. Thus, failure to appear in this table does not imply that students at this school have not performed well.

1. First 50 WACE course examinations schools (WACE Stage 3 course score of 75+)

This statistic is based on the count of Stage 3 courses in a school where a WACE course score of 75 or above was achieved. This count of courses takes into account students who achieved at this level in one or several courses (e.g. a student who achieved four WACE course scores above 75 is included in the calculation four times). This count is then converted to a percentage of the total Stage 3 courses examined at the school.

The table recognises schools which have a high proportion of students who have achieved the excellent standard in a WACE course - i.e. a WACE course score of above 75.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students or with less that 50 Stage 3 unit pairs are not included.

2. First 50 WACE course examinations schools (WACE Stage 3 course score of 65+)

This statistic is based on the count of Stage 3 courses in a school where a WACE course score of 65 or above was achieved. This count of courses takes into account students who achieved at this level in one or several courses (e.g. a student who achieved four WACE course scores above 65 is included in the calculation four times). This count is then converted to a percentage of the total Stage 3 courses examined at the school.

The table recognises schools which have a high proportion of students who have achieved the excellent or high standard in a WACE course - i.e. a WACE course score of above 65.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students or with less that 50 Stage 3 unit pairs are not included.

3. First 50 VET schools – participation

This table shows the percentage of students in a school who completed at least 220 nominal hours of VET. Schools are ranked according to the percentage of students who have completed 220 hours of more. This level of participation equates to the time required to complete four WACE course units.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students or with less than 10 students enrolled in at least 1 VET unit of competency are omitted.

4. First 50 VET schools – achievement

This table shows the percentage of VET students in a school who completed at least one Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) VET Certificate II or higher qualification. Schools are ranked according to the percentage of students who have completed at least one AQF VET Certificate II or higher qualification.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students, or with less than 10 students enrolled in at least 1 VET unit of competency, are omitted.

First 50 WACE course examination schools (WACE Stage 3 course score of 75+)

This table displays schools with the highest proportions of students who demonstrated excellent achievement in stage 3 of a course. To demonstrate excellent achievement a student needs to achieve a WACE course score of 75 or higher.

To be included in the table a student must be a full-time Year 12 student who is eligible to graduate.

Total Stage 3 Unit Pairs

This column shows the number of Stage 3 unit pairs completed by full-time Year 12 students who were eligible to graduate and who sat the WACE course examinations for Stage 3 of the course.

Number of 75+

This column shows the number of Stage 3 course unit pairs which were completed and where a WACE course score of 75 or higher was achieved.

%

This column refers to the percentage of Stage 3 course unit pairs which were completed and where a WACE course score of 75 or higher was achieved.

This table displays schools with the highest proportions of students who demonstrated high or excellent achievement in stage 3 of a course. To demonstrate high or excellent achievement a student needs to achieve a WACE course score of 65 or higher.

To be included in the table a student must be a full-time Year 12 student who is eligible to graduate.

A 'VET qualification' is a nationally recognised training qualification which is comprised of groupings of units of competency developed by industry.

Number of full-time eligible students

This column refers to the number of full-time Year 12 students in the school who are eligible to graduate.

220 or more nominal hours

This column refers to the of full-time Year 12 students in the school who are eligible to graduate and who have completed 220 or more nominal hours of VET.

%

This column refers to the percentage of full-time eligible Year 12 students in the school cohort who have completed 220 or more nominal hours of VET.

First 50 VET Schools – achievement

A 'VET qualification' is a nationally recognised training qualification which is comprised of groupings of units of competency developed by industry. A 'full VET qualification' refers to completion of the required number of units of competency for a particular qualification.

Number of VET students

This column refers to the number of full-time eligible Year 12 students who were enrolled in at least one VET unit of competency.

Achieved a Certificate II+ in Year 12

This column refers to the number of VET students in the school cohort who have completed at least one AQF VET qualification at Certificate II or higher.

%

This column refers to the percentage of VET students in the school cohort who have completed at least one AQF VET qualification at Certificate II or higher.

Schools with less than 20 full-time eligible Year 12 students or with less than 10 students enrolled in at least 1 VET unit of competency are omitted.

The data in this table are about the achievement of students at schools and should not be used to draw simplistic conclusions about the performance of schools. The following general qualifiers should be recognised:

- Many factors affect student achievement, some of which are outside the control of schools. These include differences in ability, cultural and language background, educational background of parents and economic differences.
- No single table or data source should prevail in drawing conclusions about the achievement of students at schools. A more realistic picture is gained from a composite view of all tables.
- The statistics of a single year should not be considered in isolation, rather the trend or pattern over a number of years should be considered.
- Small numbers of candidates at a school can bias inferences, particularly with percentages.

Number F/T eligible Year 12 students.

This column provides the number of full-time eligible Year 12 students registered at the school.

A 'full-time' student is in Year 11 or 12 and has results for at least eight School Curriculum and Standards Authority course units (or equivalent) in the current year, and in addition is eligible to graduate. A 'result' in a course unit means the awarding of one of the grades A, B, C, D, E, or U (unfinished).

Achievement of a WACE signifies that a student has successfully met the breadth and depth, the achievement standard and English language competence requirements in their senior secondary schooling. For 2012 and beyond these requirements are:

Breadth and depth

Complete a minimum of 20 course units or the equivalent.

The 20 course units must include at least:

- four course units from English, Literature and/or English as an Additional Language or Dialect, studied during Year 11 and Year 12 (at least two of these units must be completed in Year 12)
- one pair of course units from each of List A (arts/languages/social sciences) and List B (mathematics/science/technology) completed in Year 12.

Achievement standard

Achieve a C grade average or better across the best 16 course units of which at least eight must be completed in Year 12.

P-Stage units, endorsed programs and/or VET credit transfer can reduce the required number of course units by up to six units.

English language competence

Achieve a C grade or better in any Stage 1 or higher course unit from English, Literature and/or English as an Additional Language or Dialect (except 1A and 1B for English as an Additional Language or Dialect).

For students who have not achieved a C grade in one of their English, Literature and/or English as an Additional Language or Dialect course units, schools will need to compare a selection of the student's work with the work samples provided by the Curriculum Council to verify the student has demonstrated the required standard.

Number

This column refers to the number of full-time eligible Year 12 students who completed graduation requirements. Graduation means 'achievement of a Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)'.

Percentage

This column expresses the number of students who graduated as a percentage of all students eligible to graduate.

General Points

- Canning College, Cyril Jackson Senior Campus, North Lake Senior Campus, Tuart College, Australian Technical Colleges, overseas schools, Schools of Isolated and Distance Education and primary schools are omitted.

Explanatory notes for the Year 12 State statistics report, 2012

These notes are provided to assist in the understanding of the parameters used by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority in the compilation of the Year 12 State Statistics for 2012 (STS009) statistical report. This report relates to the participation and achievement of Year 12 students.

STS009 – Year 12 State statistics

This report consists of seven sections and can be downloaded from SIRS using the following pathway:

reports > other reports > report type: statistics > report: Year 12 State statistics.

Section 1: Summary statistics

1a Student population

This provides the number of Year 12 students who completed at least one course unit or equivalent and the number of 'repeaters', 're-enterers', overseas students and mature-age students.

Note: 'Completing' a course unit is defined as obtaining either a grade (A, B, C, D, or E) in the course unit or U notation.

'Repeaters' are Year 12 students who complete at least one course unit or equivalent in the year following first enrolment in Year 12.

'Re-enterers' are Year 12 students who complete at least one course unit or equivalent more than one year after first enrolment in Year 12.

'Mature-age' students were aged 19 or more on 1 March of the year in which their results were awarded.

1b Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)

This provides the number of full-time students who are eligible to graduate (eligible to achieve the WACE), achieve English language competence and who graduated (achieved the WACE).

The Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) is awarded to students who have successfully met the requirements for breadth and depth, the achievement standard and English language competence in their senior secondary schooling.

For 2012, these requirements were:

Breadth and depth

Students must complete at least 20 units of which at least 10 must be from WACE courses.

- The 20 units must include at least:
 - four course units from English, Literature and/or English as an Additional Language/Dialect studied during Year 11 and Year 12 (at least two of these must be completed in Year 12) and
 - one pair of course units from each of List A (arts/languages/social sciences) and List B (mathematics/science/technology) in Year 12.

Achievement standard

Students must achieve a C grade average or better across the best 16 course units of which at least eight must be completed in Year 12.

Preliminary Stage units, endorsed programs and/or VET credit transfer can reduce the required number of course units by up to six units.

English language competence

Students must achieve a C grade or better in any Stage 1 or higher course unit from English, Literature, and/or English as an Additional Language or Dialect (except 1A and 1B for English as an Additional Language or Dialect).

When students have not achieved a C grade in one of their English, Literature and/or English as an Additional Language or Dialect course units, schools may alternatively determine that a student has met the standard for English language competence through a review of samples of work by the student.

The detailed requirements for achievement of the WACE are provided in the information paper *The WACE – Your Guide to the Western Australian Certificate of Education, Statement of Results and Course Report 2012* and also on the Authority's website at http://www.scsa.wa.edu.au/internet/Senior_Secondary/The_WACE/WACE_Requirements.

It has been agreed, in consultation with stakeholders, that the percentage of graduating students is calculated from a base population consisting only of those full-time Year 12 students who could have achieved the WACE (if they had achieved at a suitable standard). The population of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE is also used as a base when calculating the numbers of WACE examination students, course unit students and VET students.

1c WACE course unit students

This provides the number of full-time students who are eligible to achieve the WACE, and who obtained a grade of A, B, C, D or E (or a U notation in exceptional circumstances) in at least two course units. Also included is the number of these students who obtained a grade of A in at least one course unit.

Generally, students taking fewer than four pairs of course units at Stage 2 or Stage 3 in Year 12 are not able to obtain an ATAR, so they may be regarded as not aspiring to university study in the following year.

1d WACE examination students

This provides the number of students who are eligible to achieve the WACE, and who obtained four or more WACE course scores. Usually students aspiring to enter university need at least four scaled scores to obtain an ATAR. Also included is the number of these students who obtained a WACE course score of 75 or more.

1e VET students

This provides the number of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE who enrolled in at least one VET unit of competency in Year 12.

Also reported are the number of students who achieved one or more VET qualification/s in Year 10, Year 11 or Year 12 and the number of students who achieved a Certificate II or higher in Year 10, Year 11 or Year 12.

Students in this category may also be included in category 1c or category 1d.

1f Endorsed program students

These students are defined as full-time students who are eligible to achieve a WACE, and who were enrolled in at least one endorsed program.

Also reported is the number of students who achieved a result in at least one endorsed program.

Students in this category may also be included in category 1c or category 1d.

Section 2: WACE course units

Table 2 shows the distribution of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE, by the number of course units completed by each student.

Section 3: WACE course examinations

Table 3 shows the distribution of full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE, by the number of WACE course examinations sat by each student. Sub-totals show the number of students who sat the WACE examination (Stage 2 or Stage 3) in enough courses to obtain an ATAR (at least four) and the number who sat the WACE examination in less than four courses. The number of WACE course examinations sat by a student is defined as the number of WACE course scores obtained.

Section 4: VET studies

VET credit transfer units of competency count towards achievement of the WACE. Where VET units of competency are integrated in Authority courses, they cannot be used to claim VET unit equivalents.

Table 4a shows the distribution of unit equivalents achieved for VET units of competency amongst full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE. A total of 55 nominal hours of VET credit transfer units of competency is equivalent to one course unit.

Table 4b shows the distribution of VET qualifications achieved amongst full-time students eligible to achieve the WACE. Students who have achieved more than one VET qualification will be counted as many times as they have achieved qualifications.

Section 5: Endorsed programs

Endorsed programs count towards the achievement of the WACE.

Table 5 shows the distribution of unit equivalents achieved for endorsed programs amongst fulltime students eligible to achieve the WACE. A unit equivalent of an endorsed program is equivalent to one course unit.

Section 6a: Summary of students' results by grade for course units

Table 6a shows the number and percentage of Year 12 students awarded each of the grades (A, B, C, D and E) for each WACE course unit by gender. In addition, statistical tests have been carried out to compare the performance of males against females within the State.

Under the heading better performing group the following entries may be found:

Entry	Meaning
Males	In this course unit, males had higher grades than females.
Females	In this course unit, females had higher grades than males.
NS	The statistical test showed no significant difference between groups.
-	No test was carried out because there were not enough candidates.

Section 6b: Summary of students' completions for P Stage course units

Table 6b shows the number of Year 12 students who completed P Stage course units by gender.

Section 7: Summary of WACE course scores

Table 7 shows the distribution of WACE course scores achieved by students for each Stage 2 and Stage 3 course (i.e. pair of units).

This distribution is shown in two ways:

- i) summary statistics of mean, maximum, minimum and standard deviation of WACE course scores
- ii) counts and percentages of students with WACE course scores in each of the five achievement bands (or standards).
